As a result, families and professionals are seeking specific knowledge and skills to improve services for children with hearing loss," said Teresa Caraway, Ph.D., President of the Academy. "We already are seeing a growing demand for Certified Auditory-Verbal Therapists." Over the next few years, the Academy will extend certification opportunities to other disciplines to improve educational opportunities for children with hearing loss."

At the meeting, the Academy board of directors also adopted Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws and established several key committees, including the Auditory-Verbal Certification Committee. The Academy board will meet again in early January 2006.
